Stocksbridge Nursery Infant School

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Welcome back everyone. It's been a very long time coming!

What's happened in school this week and what's happening next week!

- The start to school could not have gone smoother if we had tried. I am so proud of how well the children have come in each morning. We have had hardly any tears and none from our newest Reception children. Young children are amazingly resilient and adaptable and this week has proved it. I think they were all genuinely pleased to get back (and I know many parents were even keener for school to reopen). It has been lovely to hear them laughing, playing and generally enjoying school life again. And I have never seen, or had to comment on, so many new shoes at the start of a year!
- We are taking it nice and steady in school. We are planning lots
 of time to acclimatize and get back into the swing of things. For
 the next couple of weeks we are all going to use the story 'Don't
 be Silly Billy' by Anthony Browne. It will give us many
 opportunities to talk about feelings, allay any worries the children
 may have and just give them chance to become super
 comfortable with how school is now.
- The greatest changes in school are for our Y1 and Y2 children.
 Our Reception and Nursery children don't know school life
 different to how it is now. I've had one or two conversations with
 children about why they can't go on the field 'now'. We're
 explaining all the time but this concept of bubbles is hard for

- Our new Nursery children have all been for their first visit this week. They are back again next week for another longer play. It's been lovely to meet them.



Attendance & Punctuality

We haven't calculated attendance figures for this week as we have had staggered starts in Reception. We'll begin next week. Attendance has been very good in all classes all week. Dropping off and collecting on time is more important than ever to avoid bubbles crossing over. Class 1 children need to be here by 8.30am to allow the children time to organise themselves in their cloakroom and be in class before Class 2 start arriving.

In Nursery, we are using a one-way system with parents entering via Alpine Road, up the path, across the cloakroom and exiting Nursery via the fire door. They will then leave the premises by walking along the path next to Classes 6 & 7 and out of the top gate. They will be exiting from 2.55pm – 3.05pm. Would Class 5 parents please be aware of this and leave space for Nursery parents to pass? Thank you.

- By Tuesday next week, all our Reception children will be here. Those with us so far have done remarkably well considering they didn't have the usual transition.
- On Friday next week, Class 4 will be learning outside in the first of their Forest School sessions. Please see the separate letter for information.
- All our teachers are entitled to ½ day out of class for Planning, Preparation and Assessment (PPA).
 We have organised it this year so that an adult does not have to work in more than two classes (bubbles). Some of our teachers job-share i.e. work part-time and PPA is organised between them and does not involve another adult coming into the class.
 - In Class 4, Mrs Marsh will teach Class 4 on Thursdays and on Friday afternoons.
 - In Class 5, Mrs Heavens will teach on Friday afternoons allowing Miss Palmer her PPA.
 - In Class 6, Mr Barker will teach on Wednesday afternoons.
 - In Class 7, Mrs Marsh will teach on Wednesday afternoons.
 - In Nursery, Mrs Taylor will teach on Wednesdays.
 - It's a little different to how we have organised it previously but it should work.
- We will begin PE lessons w.c.14th September. The children are having lots of time to learn and play outdoors so they are not missing out on physical exercise.
