### What's happening in school next week?

At the end of next week, and the beginning of the week after, we are planning (weather permitting) to take the children out on a walk to identify these (and other) features. 

### Miss Cowley's Weekly Makaton Lesson



Here are the symbols for the signs we have learned so far:


Good morning and good afternoon.
