Erin Kerfoot. I am sure, one day, we will see Erin's name up in lights. She is a super actress and a wonderfor storyteller







Children in Class 4 were sitting in silence watching the end of a remembrance ceremony at the Albert Hall. Children from Class 2 checked that I had showed my respects and joined in with the one-minute's silence. Staff spoke afterwards about how well all the children had done, including our Nursery children. One of my mantras is to never to underestimate what young children can do. Teach them well. Set high expectations. They rarely let you down. Thank you children.
