Every half term I monitor attendance and punctuality.


Attendance at school, through this pandemic, is much better than during normal times. All this hand washing is keeping the normal bugs at bay if nothing else.

He's really trying hard.



Coronavirus

The National lockdown started at 12.01am on Thursday. <u>Guidance</u> was sent into schools on Wednesday afternoon! Whilst waiting for the guidance we have reviewed our risk assessment. There is very little else we can do additionally in school to reduce risk. Reminders to staff have been issued re the protective procedures we have in place for the children and each other. We just want to keep it at the forefront of our minds and not become complacent.

For the next month, we cannot accept visits from parents to look around school with a view to their child starting with us. We cannot accept help from any parent volunteers for the next month either.

We have bought additional hand sanitising stations and placed them outside all external doors. It has certainly shortened the queues at the sinks this week.

I joined a headteacher zoom meeting on Monday with Greg Fell, director of Public Health. It was very interesting and informative and he gave the Sheffield perspective. We have been lucky at school. We have had no positive cases. Where there have been cases in Sheffield schools it has been with the virus being brought in rather than transmitted within the school. The virus continues to spread within households and where it does spread in schools, it is mainly between staff. We are doing our utmost to adhere to 2m distancing between adults acknowledging that the children don't even know what 2m is, never mind adhere to it. We ask that you continue to support us by maintaining a 2m distance between yourselves in the playground and from staff. We want to keep this virus away from our doors for as long as we possibly can, forever would be nice but perhaps that is wishful thinking. Please help us by sticking to the rules out in the community and within your own households and families. It's hard, we know, but closing bubbles and having to educate children at home will be harder for you and for us.

Greg Fell has sent written a letter to parents that has been sent to you. There is also a useful, clear document from Sheffield City Council re when children need to isolate, for how long etc. Our Family of Schools issued something similar whilst we waited for the council to produce citywide guidance for schools.

Schools, academies, nurseries and childminders receive an email twice each week from Andrew Jones, interim Director of Education and Skills, at Sheffield City Council. In the early days we received one a day and on some days, 3, 4, 5, or 6. They have been invaluable in keeping us all together and well informed. Here is how he started today's messages:

'Yesterday saw the first day of the new national lockdown. Truly, we appreciate that this is a worrying time and as we enter our 9th month of COVID restrictions, it is very wearing too. In these circumstances, it would be easy to drop our guard or to relax too soon. **But, being resilient and vigilant – both in and out of work – are crucial to keeping COVID at bay.**'

Version 10 of the Risk Assessment has also landed. They are such a joy (?) to fill in (I let out a big sigh as I type), so you can imagine how thrilled I am at having to do another one. However, needs must. I will work through this and send it to you as before once complete.

Survey for parents of children with SEND: The Local Authority are seeking the view of parents whose children have Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. Here is the <u>link</u> to the survey.

Each week classes are awarded money for their class bank account dependent on their attendance. Keen eyed Mr. Barker, noticed a slight problem with Class 1's figures. We've rectified it so you will see their bank account is now super healthy. Not that Mr. B is competitive!

We have 49 parents registered now. It's creeping up. The app alerts the office re the reasons for absence. It's quick and easy to use and you don't have to wait for the phone line to be free!
