<ul> <li>Monday- The focus today is to use the 'ing' ending where no change is needed in the spelling of root words. And to know what a verb is.</li> <li>Doing words are called verbs. Watch verb Powerpoint. Act out some verbs and ask your child "what am I doing?" <ul> <li>Watch Adding ing Powerpoint– up to where it says, "let's move on". Do not go beyond this point.</li> <li>Use the verb photos and match them to the word. To extend write a sentence with a capital letter and full stop using that verb. Worksheet 1</li> </ul>	
Tuesday- Remind children what a verb is. Play guess the verb game. Ask your child to act out an action and you write the verb on a piece of paper using the ING suffix. Swap over. Look at PPT of rural villages in Kenya. Points to make:

- To know the difference between Rural and Urban. We are looking at Rural today.
- The material of the houses...wood and mud.
- Simple wooden frame is made then covered in mud.
- These types of houses are in Lila's village.
- There are several houses built together.
- Everyone helps to build the village.
- They cook on an open fire like the fire pit on Forest Schools.
- People are happy and enjoy their village life.
- People gather to share stories and dance.
