How you can help to improve our zoom sessions further?

Always make sure your child (and siblings) are dressed when coming onto a zoom. This is purely for safeguarding reasons which I am sure you understand.

Although parents/carers may be talking quietly in the background, the staff in school can still hear. You may need to mute your child, or just wait until the session has ended for your conversation. We know it's hard, because people or juggling lots of things but even quiet background noise is difficult to teach over.

We have had the odd session where a child has not engaged with the actual learning but has used the sessions to wander around with their device. If this happens and we feel it is disrupting the learning of others, we will end the session for that child.
