Wednesday-

Modelling: Read aloud/think aloud.

Read From the beginning again and stop at Slide 14 then go back to slide 10 and answer these questions..

- Why do you think 'HUGE' is written in capital letters? How are the other guests feeling when they see Bear? What might they be thinking? Bear asks for a wake-up call on February 21st. True or false? Can you use three words to describe the hotel?
- Slide 11 Which words tell us that Bear is excited and pleased with his new room? From where does Bear drink a huge slurp of water?
- Slide 12 Can you sequence these events? Can you remember what he did first? They are on slide 20 for the children to look at.
- Bear dries his hair
- Bear has a shower and uses all the shampoo and hot water

Monday-

- What happened? (It was too hot to milk the cow/weed etc.)
- What was the problem? (It didn't rain)
- What was the solution? (Her Grandad told her she had to climb the mountain to get it to rain)
- How did the story end?

Fill in the story matrix (in resources) as you answer these questions. If your child prefers to draw pictures to answer the questions, then use the matrix without lines.

This is just a plan – we do not expect your child to write sentences here, just notes/words.

This may take more than one session.





Tuesday-

Look at the plot matrix you made yesterday.

Talk about the first 3 boxes – Where? Who? What?

Ask your child to describe where the story takes place.

Tell the children that you want to hear them talking in sentences.

(They might say 'in the village'.)

How can we improve our sentences?

Use an adjective and add some more information.

(So, your child's improved sentence might be – 'In the small Kenyan village where Lila lived.')

Begin to write some sentences – one or two for each heading from the plot matrix, just thinking about where, who and what.

Remind your child to use finger spaces, capital letters and full stops in every sentence.

Encourage them to use phonics to spell hard words.

When they have finished, ask them to re-read their writing to check it makes sense.
