 Monday- Explain to your child that this week we're going to use a film clip for shared reading. DON'T SHOW ANY OF THE CLIP TODAY. Give your child some background information about the clip. It is called 'Catch It' and it is about meerkats. Can your child remember any facts about meerkats from the video we watched? Can your child remember the name of the story we read that was about a meerkat too? What might the meerkats be trying to catch? Show your child the opening picture from the film (see resources for image.) Discuss with your child the savannah being the habitat for meerkats. What might they be trying to catch on the savannah? What can they see? Does it remind them of anything? Main activity – Ask the children to record their prediction - encourage the children to begin their thoughts with 'I predict' or 'I think that' 	Monday- The sound we will be today teaching is: ue making 'oo' <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BCeE3B_tAq8</u> Word on spelling sheet: tissue Other words: Glue, blue, true, issue, clue Read this sentence aloud for your child to write down: The tissue was covered in glue.

It is important that children are able to compare data within the pictograms. Have a go at worksheet 1. An alternative practical way to explore pictograms is attached. Children will choose a scenario care and display it using a pictogram. Children will need to make a key for reference eg 1 donut ring = 2.

Children also need to be able to halve 2 and 10 It is important the children are exposed to both horizontal and vertical pictograms. You can ask the following questions to check your child's understanding: How can we represent 0 on a pictogram? What does the pictogram show? What is each symbol worth? Complete lesson 3 worksheet. Extension activities are available – the more stars, the harder the questions.

Using their innovated grid, story mountain and story map, your child is to write the ending of their innovated story. Moving from objects (like counters) to pictures, children build block diagrams using cubes and then move to drawing and interpreting block diagrams. Main Activity		

Using their actual landscapes or photos of it children draw their own map from the from the 3D model that they made last week. Remember that maps are taken from a birds eye view – looking down. Children could take a photo of their 3D landscapes from above and have a look what a map might look like. To reinforce this, they could draw over the photo to show the features and how they would look on a map if you looked down on them.

Children should also transfer over their map key that they made last week.

Science - To use our local environment to understand habitats and micro- habitats

To look at a microhabitat and name an animal living there.

To record findings by drawing and labelling.

Introduction

Explain to the children that there are habitats within habitats called micro habitats. We have a habitat in our school called the meadow. Do you have any habitats in your garden or near your home? Discuss all the animals you would expect to see in the meadow.

Ask the children is a log a habitat? Is a stone? Perhaps under them.

These are called micro habitats- small habitats where living organisms live and survive.

Main Activity

To go into your garden, local park or for a walk and conduct a survey. We are going to look at a micro habitat by lifting some of the logs. Explain when we lift logs or stones you are going into another living things home so we don't stand in it and we don't throw the log somewhere else as the animals will get cold and die.

Children to find a micro habit and study it. What do they see? Can they see decomposers? Can they name them? Children to draw any observations they make and label them. They might see a wood louse, worm, centipede.

Take magnifying glasses out and look on top of the log is there anything living there?

Can the children put the living homes back the way they were and talk about if they didn't cover the stones which part of the food chain would happen next? The bird would come and eat them?
