Wow!

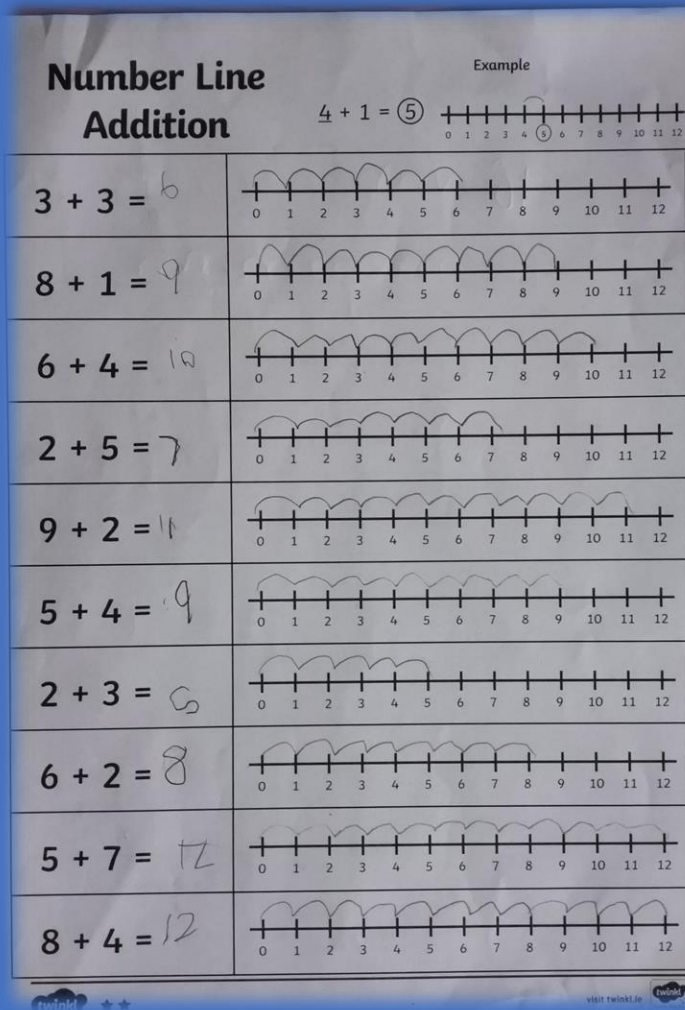
Look at this amazing African hut. It was also so nice to meet Winner this week. He was shown on zoom as 'something precious'.

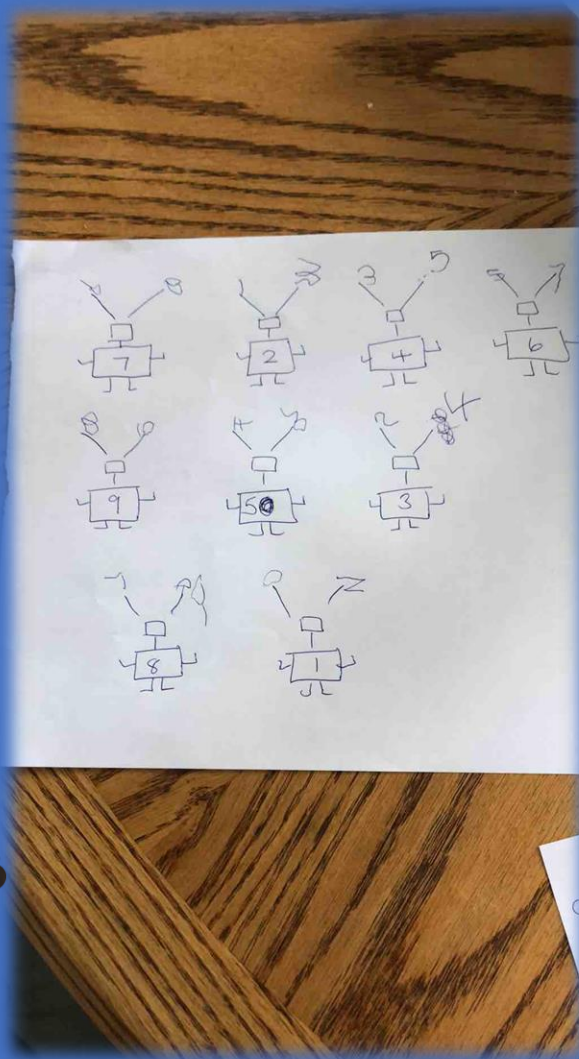
Tortoise racing on the
