stupendous.






Great home and school learning.

It's terrific.










Alfie H is on fire

He's doing super well with his spellings each week. Well done Alfie.






A phonics game.

Well done George P and thank you for always coming along to the story zooms. It's nice to see you.










He joined in with everything Mrs P asked him to do.
