Weekly Phonics Task

Monday - Activate the children's background knowledge:

Before reading....

Slide 1 – What do you think the word wild means? (Ask for ideas) It could be a wild garden – a garden that hasn't been looked after.

Slide 2 – Or it could be a wild animal like this wolf. What makes it wild? It is untamed – it's not like your dogs or cats that live with you. Name as many wild animals as you can – tell your adult.

Slide 3 – it could even be wild weather, like this storm.

Wild makes us think of something that's a little bit scary, doesn't it? Slide 4 - Look at the book cover. Read the title. Who is the author and illustrator? Maurice Sendak.

The story was going to be called *Where the Wild Horses Are.* I wonder why the author changed the title? Remember he was also the illustrator...He couldn't draw horses but he could draw Things! I wonder who that boat belongs to and where it's going? Have you ever been on a boat? Maybe someone is going to go on a journey?

Look at this creature – what do you think it is? It has human feet! It's a wild thing! So, in this story, is a wild thing a monster?

Do you know any other stories about monsters?

What do you think might be going to happen in the story?

Slide 5 – This is the title page. What do you think the boy is wearing? A costume, it looks like a onesie! I wonder why he's wearing a crown? Do you think he is scared of the wild things? They look more scared of

Slide 8 – Poor dog! Max is chasing him with a fork! I'm sure you wouldn't do that to your pets would you?

What do you think will happen when Max's Mum sees what he's doing?

Slide 9 – Look at the text – what do you notice? Capital letters. Why are they there?

We've seen the words "Wild Thing" before haven't we? In the title.

How do you think Max might be feeling now?

Look at slide 10

Do you think his Mum was right to send him to bed without any supper?

Maybe you could draw a picture of Max in his wolf suit to show me tomorrow.

Read through the story to slide 11 where we got to yesterday.

What was happening to Max in the story so far? Remember, he got sent to his room without any supper because he was being mischievous.

Slide 12&13 – Wow! Imagine a forest growing in your bedroom! Can you make yourself small and then stretch up into a tall forest tree?

Slides 14&15 – How do you think Max feels about a forest growing in his bedroom? He seems to think it's funny!

Slide 21 – Max doesn't look so happy now, does he? Why not?

Slide 22 - terrible - can you tell your adult another word that means the same as terrible? (horrible, nasty, awful, ghastly, gross...)

gnashed – means grinding their teeth together – do you think they are trying to frighten Max?

Can you gnash your teeth? Roll your eyes? Show your terrible claws?

Slide 23 – what do you think Max might do now? What would you do if you were Max? I think I would get back in my boat and sail away as quickly as possible!

Slide 24&25- Max said "Be still"

Slide 26 – What do you think Max will do now that he is the King of the Wild Things?

Imagine that you are king or queen of the wild things...tell your adult what you would do. (build a palace? Make them work for him?)

Slide 37 – I wonder what the wild things will do now that Max has gone? Maybe they will have a sleep after all that rumpus!

Slide 38 - 41 - Max sails home. Can you sail your boat home? Around your room and back to your chair!

His food is still hot! Surely it would have gone cold after all the time he's been away!?

Do you think Max really went to the land where the wild things are...?

Let's just have a think about the story setting. Where is the story set / where does it happen? The land where the wild things are.

What is it like? A jungle.


