

Sand Play

I am almost half way through a Diploma learning how to better support children who have experienced traumatic events. We all respond differently to things happening in our lives – losing pets, moving schools, losing loved ones, changing classes, having different teachers, seeing something frightening. One of the strategies I have learned is helping children process their emotions through sand play. To do this I need a large range of miniature toys so that the children can choose what is appropriate to tell their little story. Children eligible for Free School Meals and the Easter Holidays.

Sheffield City Council are providing food vouchers over the Easter holidays to support families whose children are eligible for Free School Meals. Families will receive a £30 voucher for each child. Letters will be sent directly to you from the council next week. The letter will include the link to the website. If you need any help downloading your voucher/s then please get in touch with us.

Parents will need to go to the following website www.selectourcompliment.co.uk/grocery to redeem your voucher. You will then need to enter your 16 digit e-code and choose the supermarket you wish to shop at. The E-Gift card/voucher will arrive by email within 24 hours. Remember to check your junk/spam folder in case it's been delivered there.

Remote Learning Phase 3!

We continue to develop and change what we are doing remotely to meet the changing situations. Now that all the children are back in school, we return to the scenario where we have single children isolating sometimes. We want to offer these children access to live teaching via zoom.

We would position the technology in the classroom so that the child could see the screen and the teacher. This way, any child at home isolating would still be able to access the phonics input, a maths input and a shared reading input each day. The links to the sessions would be shared on the planning document and this would only be shared with the isolating child's parents. No one else would be able to access the zoom session or the learning.

The child, and parent at home, would be able to hear responses from other children in the classroom but this is not very different from being able to see and hear them via zoom when we had more children at home. The only difference being you would have window into the classroom rather than everyone's home!

If there is a reason you would not want your child to be in a class when an isolating child was accessing it via zoom, then please let me know.

Please log on to zoom using your child's first name only. There is no need for surnames and this makes it more secure in terms of GDPR. Please make sure your child is dressed and in a suitable environment. During phonics sessions it's important they are not eating so they can join in with saying the phonemes etc. An adult needs to be in the room whilst the sessions are

We will begin this way of working after Easter.
