Madeline Pearson for cheery hellos in the morning. She always uses the Makaton signs too.

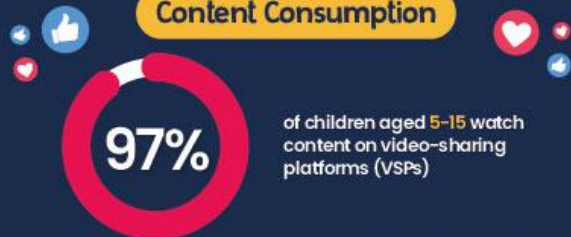
