

### The Reception Curriculum

We will talk more with you about this from September onwards.

The children's learning all begins and develops from great books, things the children are interested in and their starting point. The three areas we focus on most at the very beginning are:

- 1) their personal, social and emotional development
- 2) their communication and language talk, talk and more talk!
- 3) their physical development big play and little play.

Without these skills, learning is harder. Then we focus on:

- literacy learning letters, reading, writing,
- maths
- their understanding of the world around them.
- expressive arts and design



Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage

Setting the standards for learning, development and care for children from birth to five

Published: 31 March 2021 Effective: 1 September 2021

#### School Readiness

Between the ages of four and five, children should be prepared to be separated from their parent or main care giver.

Children should be able to clearly demonstrate their ability to listen and follow age appropriate instructions

Children should have enough of a range of vocabulary and language to express their needs, feelings, thoughts or ideas

To be able to interact in an age appropriate way with another child or adult. Children should be able to share and play and take responsibility for their actions.

Respond to boundaries and rules

To be able to engage with books, have some understanding of words and language

Communicate their needs such as toileting, thirst, hunger illness and so on.

To be able to engage with books, have some understanding of words and language.

Schools will also work with parents, enabling a coordinated response to your child's needs as they arise, supporting children and their families as they work on issues that can be a barrier school readiness

Parents who feel they have a child who is behind or struggling to meet some of the 'school readiness' markers should contact their health visitor, GP or children's center. All of whom are well placed to provide the early intervention required to support parents and children through the transition from toddlerhood, pre-school years and on into later childhood.



# We celebrate positive behaviour in lots of ways.

- Golden Time/Reward Time when the children have earned marbles, pompoms...whatever the class reward system is.
- Each class chooses someone to be Star of the Day and they sit on the Funky Chair, and are celebrated at the end of each week in assembly.
- Golden VIP tickets for those children who always keep the Golden Rules. Biscuits for the class with the most tickets on a Friday.

# Why does ATTENDANCE matter so much?



#### **Attendance**

- Monitor attendance each half term and celebrate good attendance with the children.
- Write to parents where there are concerns re level of attendance and/or lateness. Since September 2015 all Stocksbridge and Deepcar Schools have worked together, adopting same procedures, paperwork etc with regard to attendance.
- A new term time leave policy came into effect in September 2013. All requests for leave in term time must be made in writing giving 20 days notice. Only those deemed exceptional circumstances will be authorised. The Local Authority issue fines for unauthorised absences of five consecutive days or more. This comes into effect the term after your child's 5<sup>th</sup> birthday.

If I could ask two things of you......
