

Supporting Maths at Home

In school we use White Rose to teach maths. They have introduced a new, free maths app. On first viewing it looks a good way for children to practise their early maths skills. It states that it is suitable for KS1 (Year One and Two) children but I think it would be great for our Reception children too, and any budding mathematicians in Nursery. Sometimes, numbers are children's 'thing' from a very early age.
