Snowy days leading to later opening, early pick-ups or school closure

We try our absolute best to open on time each day but sometimes the bad weather may mean we have to open later (to allow staff chance to get into work). We let parents know via our own eschools email system. We also inform the Local Authority via a dedicated service. This information is then published on the <u>School Closure</u> page of the council website. <u>Sheffield City Council</u> You can also sign up <u>here</u>, to receive the information straight to your inbox. The council also <u>tweet</u> the information. If there are changes to our opening we ask that parents do not telephone school but check using one of the services above. Ringing school merely blocks up our phone lines.

A heartfelt plea for your assistance and cooperation from Alpine Lodge

The staff at Alpine Lodge have contacted us a few times this half term in relation to parents parking on their premises at school start and end times. On occasion, the parking has been such that their staff have been unable to use the car park in order to start their work shifts and even more worryingly, access to the building has been blocked, preventing emergency vehicle access.

We all appreciate that vehicle access to our school is limited. However, behavior that impacts on our neighbours and potentially puts life at risk is not acceptable. We and the Lodge are therefore reaching out to our parents and carers to please be more consider of others when dropping off and picking up your child.

The Lodge car park is private land and must not be used by parents and carers for school business. The school advocates active travel to school. If you are not able to arrive on foot, as many of us cannot, please consider parking and striding to school instead of trying to park immediately outside. The Sports Centre car park is an ideal location for this. Parking and walking from the ample parking there should only add an extra few minutes to your journey and this simple action can help us provide a safer environment for our children as they arrive and leave school.
