Time to start school?

If your child was born between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019 you need to apply for a place for your child (even if your child attends our Nursery). The Sheffield City Council website for applying online is now closed. However, you can still apply by posting the application form by **15th January 2023**. We can send your application form to Sheffield City Council on your behalf. If you still need to apply please call in to the school office and ask for a form.

Time to apply for a Year 3 place at Junior School?

If your child is currently in Year 2, you need to apply for a Year 3 place at Junior School. The closing date for applications is **15th January 2023**. We have hard copies of the application form, which we can submit to Sheffield City Council on your behalf, if you have not already done so. Please call in to the school office and ask for a form.

Punctuality and the gates

For quite a long time we were very short staffed in the office. Leaving the office to deliver children to classes and Nursery, who came in late, was tricky as it left the gate and phones unmanned. But, we have a full staff now, thank goodness. Going forward, office staff will 'deliver' all children, arriving after 8.30/8.45 to their correct classrooms.

On another note, school starts either at 8.30am or 8.45am dependent on which class your child is in. If they arrive after these times, they should enter via the office only, not via any other opened gate. This is so we can ensure they are 'logged in' appropriately and lunches are ordered. It is particularly relevant for parents of children in Classes 5 & 6. Whilst you can enter the top gate after 8.45am, it is only open to allow Nursery parents to exit. Many thanks in advance for your co-operation.

Cleaner & Mealtime Supervisor Vacancies




This young man won trainer of the month in December at cricket and here he is with his trophy. Well done!


Wildcats Girl's Football

Jewelry in PE and at after school clubs

Our school policy is that children do not wear jewelry for PE. This is best practice. It's not statutory but it is, as a school, what we have chosen to do. When I first came to the school I asked staff if there were any issues they wanted help with. Earrings in PE came up, much to my surprise. Staff did not want the responsibility of taping up ears to add protection for PE lessons, knowing that, if a child's ear was injured because they were wearing earrings, ultimately school could be culpable.

In July I will remind parents that if they are thinking of getting their child's ear's pierced, they should do so at the very start of the holiday. It is included in all our induction materials.



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
