
- Harriett Ottoway did some super spelling and Freya Morgan did some wonderful reading

Jack was busy last weekend helping paint the garage. Looks like he did a good job too!




## Comic Relief – Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March 2023


## **FOSNI Stall**

The parental controls can stop the iPad from displaying explicit or age-inappropriate content (in apps like iTunes and Safari, for instance) when your child is signed into their account.
