

Key Vocabulary:

Modern – relating to present and recent time.
Injured – hurt, damage, or loss sustained.
Crowded - filled with many or too many people or things.

Medicines - a drug or other preparation for the treatment or prevention of disease.

Trained - having been taught a particular skill or type of behaviour through practice and instruction over a period of time.

Key Vocabulary:

Watch – the name used to refer to a team of firefighters.
Emergency - a serious, unexpected, and often
dangerous situation requiring immediate action.
Rescue - an act of saving or being saved from danger or
difficulty.

Investigator - a person whose job is to examine a crime, problem, statement, etc. in order to discover the truth.

Key Questions?

- Why are firefighters important?
- How can firefighters help during an emergency?
 How is fire useful?
- Why do we need to be careful around fire?
- Where is our local Fire Station located?

Key Vocabulary:

Paramedic - a person trained to give emergency medical care to people who are injured or ill, typically in a setting outside a hospital.

Machines - an apparatus using mechanical power and having several parts, each with a definite function and together performing a particular task.

Ambulance - a vehicle equipped for taking sick or injured people to and from hospital, especially in emergencies. Equipment - the necessary items for a particular purpose.

Key Questions?

- Why are Paramedics important?
- What equipment do they have in the ambulance? How do the ambulance know when there is an emergency?
- How do you contact emergency services? What are paramedics trained to do?

Key Vocabulary:

Shift - the group of people who work during a particular time.

Ward - a separate room in a hospital, typically one allocated to a particular type of patient.

Theatre – the room in a hospital where operations happen.

Incubator – a plastic cot in a hospital that keeps small babies warm and safe.

Surgery – The process of operating on someone.

Key Questions:

- What different jobs do nurses complete every day? Why is it important the nurses work as a team?
- Who else works in a hospital?
- Where else might you find a nurse working?

<u>Science</u>

The children will be observing seasonal changes. This is something we will revisit each time we arrive into a new season. Autumn is a beautiful time of year and one that the children love to explore.

We will also be recapping our learning about materials and their suitability for different purposes. We will be naming and testing their physical properties. This will link to our Design and Technology work (making hand puppets)



Design and Technology


This half term is all about sewing. We will be designing and making a hand puppet of one of our favourite Hidden Heroes. Watch this space, we may need helpers to come and thread needles!



Mathematics


Addition and Subtraction

The children will learn about parts and wholes. They will use their knowledge of part, part, whole to answer addition and subtraction number stories. Before, moving onto missing number problems. Children will use a range of apparatus and practical activities to support their learning and understanding.



<u>Shape</u>

The children will learn to recognise and name 3D shapes. They will use their previous learning on 2D shapes to recognises different faces on a 3D shape.

<u>Jigsaw – Celebrating differences</u>

In this topic, the children are learning about friendships and how to include others when working and playing. They will explore how to solve problems and how to recognise if ·someone is being bullied. We will celebrate anti-bullying week commencing 13th November.

Computing

The children will develop their understanding of a range of tools used in digital painting. Children will then use these tools to create their own digital painting.

<u>Indoor – Dance</u>

The children will explore travelling actions, movement and balancing. They will learn why it is important to count in music and use this in their dances.

Outdoor – Ball skills

The children will explore and develop their fundamental ball skills such as throwing and catching, rolling and dribbling with both hands and feet. They will look to perform these skills with increasing control and accuracy using co-ordination

History

This half term has a strong emphasis on history as we explore the historical figure of Florence Nightingale. We will be learning about how she contributed to national and international achievements and how she has influenced life today. We will be comparing how hospitals have changed over time and will also be having a visit from a paramedic, who will be bringing an ambulance to school.



<u>Art</u>

Children will be developing colour and texture to create an Autumn tree picture.





<u>RE</u>

The children will explore stories and celebrations of Christmas and Diwali. They will learn about the social and emotional aspect to these festivals and celebrations.

English

Grammar

We will continue practising letter formation and the positioning of letters using our handwriting lines. It is essential that the children form their letters correctly as this will help when they move onto joining their letters in Year 2.
