Parking

On Friday, last week, school received a letter from South Yorkshire Police. It was regarding the number of complaints they had had about parking at drop off and pick up times. They have asked us to remind parents about not parking on double yellow lines or the zig zag lines and also about parking considerately and courteously.

We have been informed that the local policing team will monitor the situation when they are in the area and should parking not improve, they will take formal action for those not abiding by traffic laws.

School has contacted South Yorkshire Police providing information of all they try to do to ensure parking is legal and safe. It's ironic that the letter arrived at the end of two weeks where we have been promoting Active Travel.

Illnesses in School

We have some particularly nasty bugs in school at the moment. This week it has mainly been in Classes 5,6,7 & 8 but there have been ill children in all our classes (other than Nursery). On Tuesday we contacted Public Health because we had so many children absent with temperatures, coughs and flu like symptoms. There advice was to increase the number of times the children were washing and sanistising hands. We have been cleaning frequently touched surfaces more (not easy with no Mr G and no cleaners but we've done it!) We have talked to the children about catching colds and coughs, putting tissues in bins and washing hands. We have opened windows, despite the temperatures, to ensure better ventilation.

The advice was that if your child has mild cold like symptoms, they should come to school. If they have a temperature then they should remain at home.

The virus is spreading through staff which has made the week quite tricky so we ask that you don't send your child to school with a temperature or we may never get rid of the bug. As I walked through the hall yesterday, I was asked if I could take the part of a king as all our actors were off ill.

We have lots of parents registered with Studbugs and it really is the quickest way to let us know about your child's absence. It's an efficient way of letting us know how your child is each day and saves Miss Marshall in the office having to phone parents to check in with you. Here is how to register.

Punctuality

The vast majority of our children come to school everyday on time. Many are here early waiting for the doors to open at 8.20am. However, too many of our children are coming late too often.

Over the last 8 weeks we have recorded 497 late marks in registers. On average 12 children have been late each day since the 2nd October. The implications of your child being late are:

- They miss the social time in the morning with their friends.
- Some children feel very uncomfortable walking into a settled class late.
- They miss out on all the routines we do each day the timetable, checking in with each other about how they are feeling.
- Frequently the office is not manned as staff take children to their classrooms. The phone isn't answered. The gate isn't answered etc.
- As soon as register is finished we begin teaching for the day which usually starts with our phonic input. The pace of phonics teaching is fast....it has to be to get through it all and late children miss out on this and so find it tricky to keep up, or fall behind.

I have contacted Bliss Holland, who is our Attendance and Inclusion Officer from the Local Authority to ask for her support in improving punctuality. We want to support parents so that it's easier to get your child to school on time. We have booked in some dates to meet with parents who are regularly late to see what we can do help.


